## Terms & Stitches - US Terms

st(s) x6 - stitch(es)

ch - chain

sk - skip

dc - double crochet

sc - single crochet

sl st - slip stitch

rep - repeat

## Special Stitch - Foundation Row Crochet

### **FDC - Foundation Double Crochet**

Ch3, yo and insert hook into third chain from hook, pull up a loop (3 loops on hook). Yo and pull through 1 loop (this creates the base stitch (chain) for the next fdc), you should still have 3 loops on your hook. Now complete a dc stitch (yo and pull through 2 loops, yo and pull through 2 loops again to complete the dc stitch). To start the next stitch, yo and insert hook into the 'v' of the base stitch, yo and pull up a loop (chain created), now complete a dc stitch as before. Continue this sequence for the number of stitches in your desired width.

**THE CHAIN 3 at the beginning of your Foundation Row COUNTS as a chain stitch and then the other 2 chains are your first DC.**

# Sunny Days BLOCK

**Row 1:** FDC 43

Alternately, chain 44 and dc in 2nd ch from hook and in each across - 43 dc.

**Rows 2-4:** Dc across

**Row 5:** 21 , 21

**Row 6:** 13 , 7 , 7 , 13

**Row 7:** 14 , 6 , 6 , 14

**Row 8:** 15 , 5 , 5 , 15

**Row 9:** 16 , 2 , 1 , 1 , 2 , 16

**Row 10:** 17 , 7 , 17

**Row 11:** 16 , 9 , 16

**Row 12:** 8 , ( 1 , ) x4 then 9 , ( 1 , ) x4 then 8

**Row 13:** 16 , 9 , 16

**Row 14:** 17 , 7 , 17

**Row 15:** 16 , 2 , 1 , 1 , 2 , 16

**Row 16:** 15 , 5 , 5 , 15

**Row 17:** 14 , 6 , 6 , 14

**Row 18:** 13 , 7 , 7 , 13

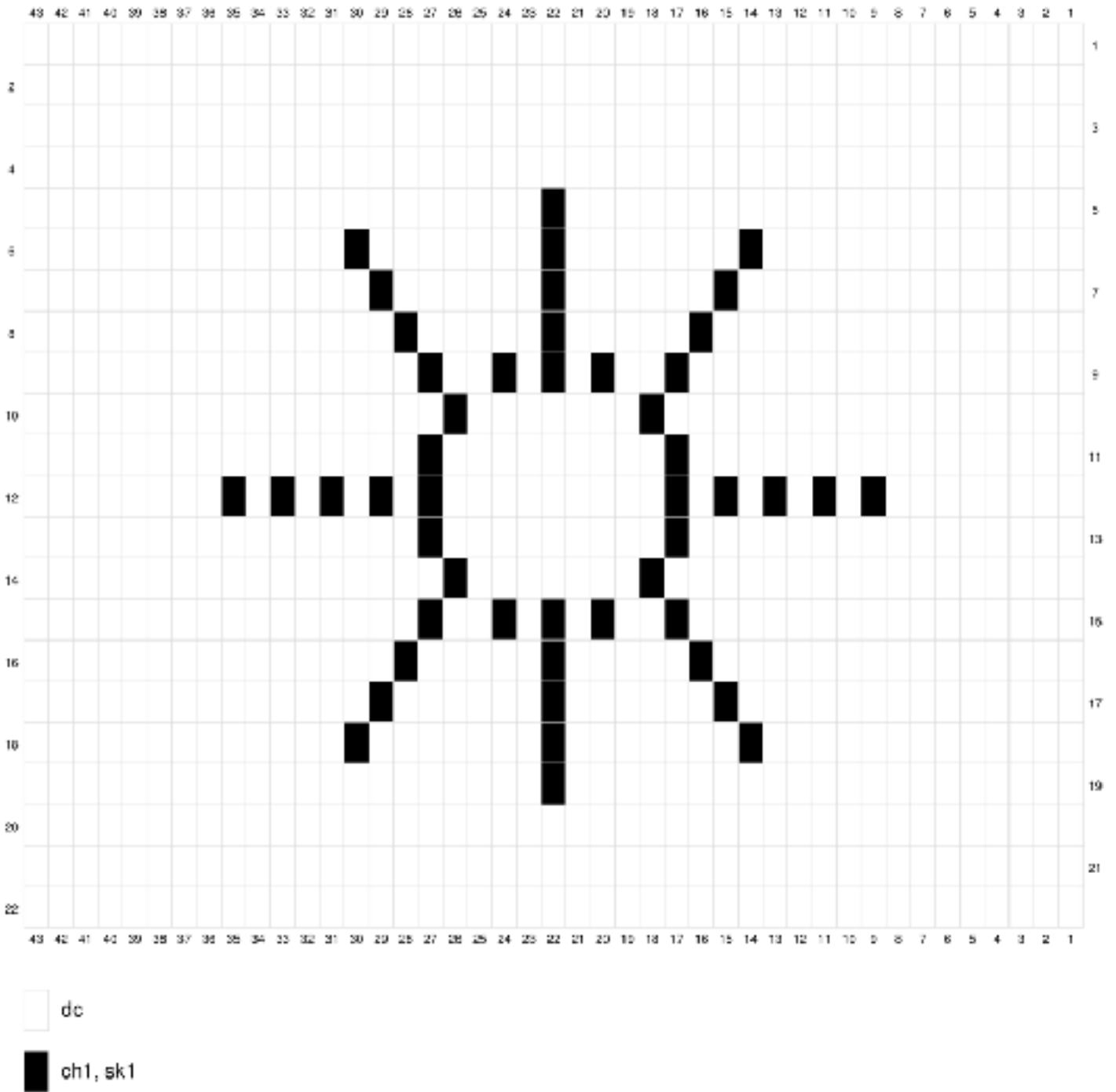
**Row 19:** 21 , 21

**Rows 20-22:** Dc across

**Row 23/Rnd 1 - Ch1 and rotate (not turn) to work down the left side of your block.** \*Make 2sc around the post of each dc down the side (44sc). Rotate to work along row. 2sc in first stitch (first sc is the corner - mark it), sc 20, 2sc in next st, sc 20, 2sc in the last stitch (last sc is the corner - mark it)\* Repeat between the \* then sl st to your first sc and finish off.

# 2020 BLANKET - JULY Panel

This pattern is for one panel of a twin-sized bed blanket at approximately 54" by 80" using DK yarn. You will add the rows for each new design every month for a total of 12 different of designs and 214 rows. In December border instructions will be included to finish your blanket.

...Continued from June-

Place stitch markers as you make Row 108 in stitch

39, 78, 117, 156, 195, 234

**Row 108:** Dc across

**Row 109:** 4 ( 17 , 21 ) x6

**Row 110:** ( 13 , 7 , 7 , 9 ) x6 then 4

**Row 111:** 4 ( 10 , 6 , 6 , 14 ) x6

**Row 112:** ( 15 , 5 , 5 , 11 ) x6 then 4

**Row 113:** 4 ( 12 , 2 , 1 , 1 , 2 , 16 ) x6

**Row 114:** ( 17 , 7 , 13 ) x6 then 4

**Row 115:** 4 ( 12 , 9 , 16 ) x6

**Row 116:** ( 8 , ( 1 , ) x4 then 9 , ( 1 , ) x4 then 4 ) x6 then 4

**Row 117:** 4 ( 12 , 9 , 16 ) x6

**Row 118:** ( 17 , 7 , 13 ) x6 then 4

**Row 119:** 4 ( 12 , 2 , 1 , 1 , 2 , 16 ) x6

**Row 120:** ( 15 , 5 , 5 , 11 ) x6 then 4

**Row 121:** 4 ( 10 , 6 , 6 , 14 ) x6

**Row 122:** ( 13 , 7 , 7 , 9 ) x6 then 4

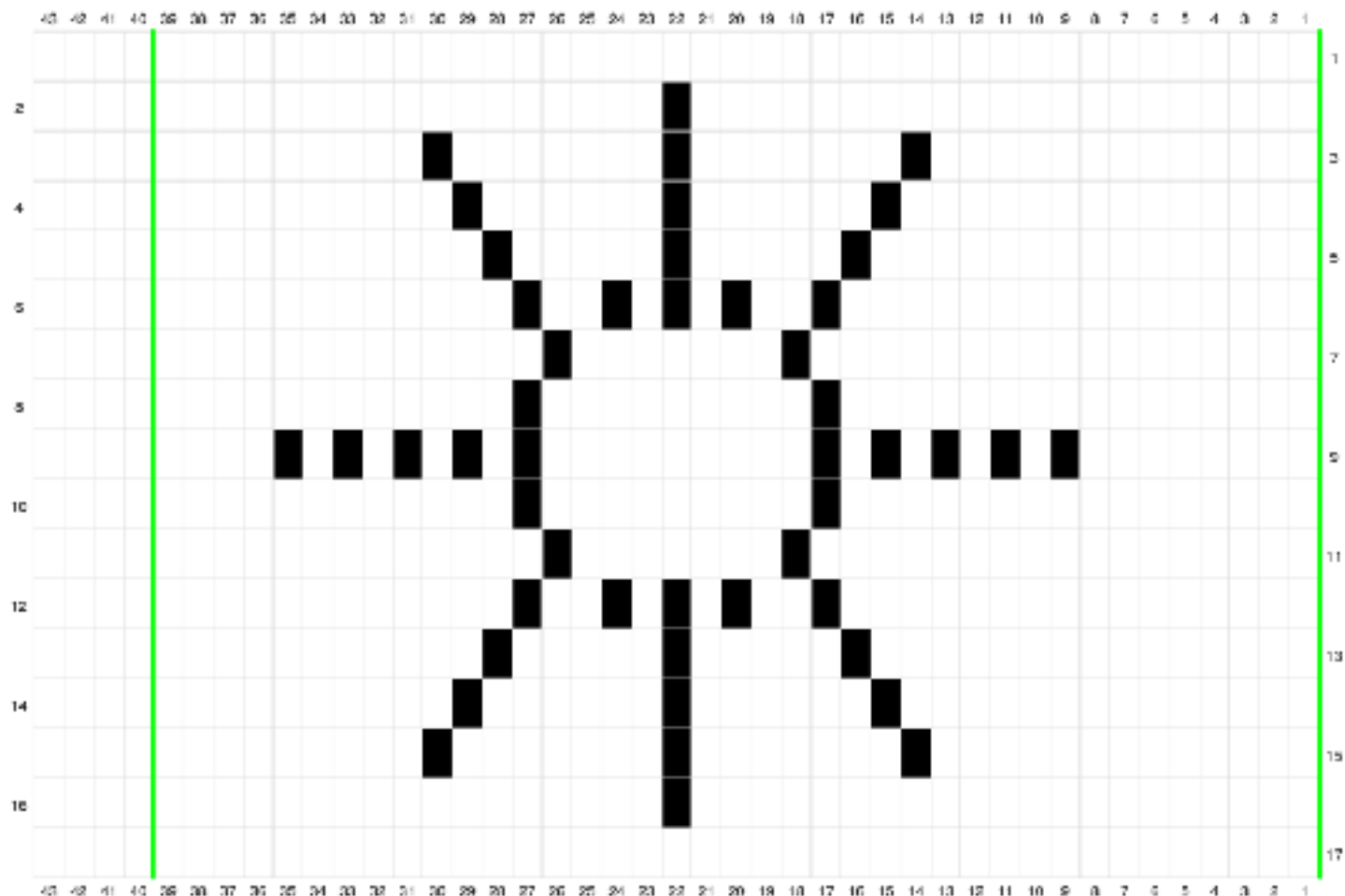
**Row 123:** 4 ( 17 , 21 ) x6

**Row 124:** Dc across (238 sts). If you're doing one color, put a marker in your blanket so it doesn't unravel. If you plan to change colors, finish off this color now.

# SUMMER SUNSET THROW

- **This pattern can be increased or decreased** in multiples of 35 sts across and 17 rows to create ANY size blanket.
- **Summer Sunset Throw** - Using the yarn, hook, and repeats specified below, with a Moss Stitch border as show, you'll create a blanket approximately 42 by 54 inches, depending on your tension.

## Summer Sunset Throw - Supplies Needed

- 2 balls (400 yards) each of Paintbox Simply Aran in Tomato Red\* (212), Blood Orange (219), Bright Peach (211), Bubblegum Pink (250) , Dark Aubergine (248), Midnight Blue (237), and White

\* Tomato Red (212) x6 has been discontinued! I had 2 balls left in my stash and wanted to use them up. If you don't have 2 balls in your stash, then you can substitute with Rose Red (213).

- 5mm hook
- Stitch Markers
- Yarn Needle

Place stitch markers during Row 1 in stitch:  
35, 70, 105

**Row 1:** With Midnight Blue, FDC 140; in repeats just dc across for 140 sts.

Alternately, chain 141 and dc in 3rd ch from hook and in each across. The ch2 at the beginning counts as a dc - 140 sts.

**Row 2:** (17 , 17) x4

**Row 3:** (9 , 7 , 7 , 9) x4

**Row 4:** (10 , 6 , 6 , 10) x4

**Row 5:** (11 , 5 , 5 , 11) x4

**Row 6:** (12 , 2 , 1 , 1 , 2 , 12) x4



**Row 7:** (13 , 7 , 13) x4

**Row 8:** (12 , 9 , 12) x4

**Row 9:** (4 , 1 , 1 , 1 , 1 , 9 , 1 , 1 , 1 , 1 , 4) x4

**Row 10:** (12 , 9 , 12) x4

**Row 11:** (13 , 7 , 13) x4

**Row 12:** (12 , 2 , 1 , 1 , 2 , 12) x4

**Row 13:** (11 , 5 , 5 , 11) x4

**Row 14:** (10 , 6 , 6 , 10) x4

**Row 15:** (9 , 7 , 7 , 9) x4

**Row 16:** (17 , 17) x4

**Row 17:** dc across

**Row 18:** dc across in Dark Aubergine

**Row 19:** dc across in Midnight Blue

**Rows 20-36:** Using Dark Aubergine, repeat Rows 1-17

**Row 37:** dc across in Bubblegum Pink

**Row 38:** dc across in Dark Aubergine

**Rows 39-55:** Using Bubblegum Pink, repeat Rows 1-17

**Row 56:** dc across in Bright Peach

**Row 57:** dc across in Bubblegum Pink

**Rows 58-74:** Using Bright Peach, Repeat Rows 1-17

**Row 75:** dc across in Blood Orange

**Row 76:** dc across in Bright Peach

**Rows 77-93:** Using Blood Orange, repeat Rows 1-17

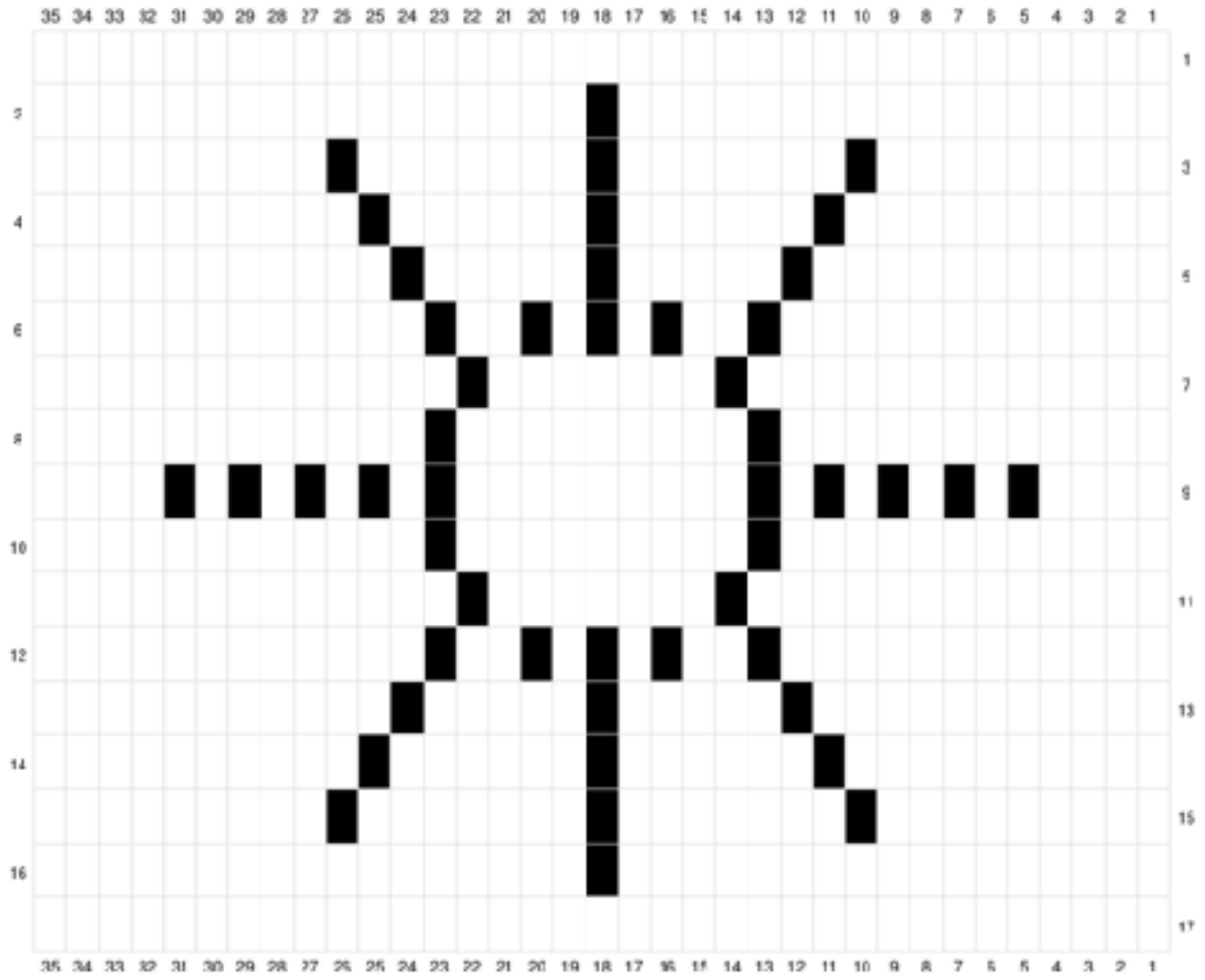
**Row 94:** dc across in Tomato Red

**Row 95:** dc across in Blood Orange

**Rows 96-112:** Using Tomato Red, repeat Rows 1-17

# summer sunset THROW BORDER

**Rnd 1 (in white OR in colors to match your panels for a cleaner initial edging):** Ch1 and start by going down the left side of your block first, making 2sc around each dc post (or row) down the side. Next you'll do 2sc into the first stitch along the bottom of the block (mark the first st of this increase - this is a corner). Now sc in each stitch across to the last chain/FDC where you'll do another 2sc (mark the second st of this increase - this is a corner). Continue in this manner around your block, making sure to make the increase for the next corner. You'll end with 2sc in the last stitch, the second of which is your final corner. Join with a slst to your first sc.

**Now you can border how ever you desire** - I did a Moss Stitch Border in all my colors using a 5.5mm hook so my sc and chains didn't get too tight and cause my blanket to bunch up (After finishing, I think a 6mm would have been even better for my personal tension). You can learn the Moss Stitch (it's very simple and great for beginners) by searching "crochet moss stitch" on YouTube - **OR follow the quick & simple one below-**

**Rnds 2-4:** Ch 3 (counts as dc here and through border), \*dc next st and in each st around, doing (2dc, ch1, 2dc) into each corner sc. Slst to top of starting ch3. Ch3, turn.\* Repeat between \* around your blanket.
